Oracy Competition for Gloucestershire's Infant, Junior and Primary Schools

• **Competition launch!**

• **Schools sign up via Google Form to enter KS1/LKS2/UKS2 competition by 15.11.24**

• **Class and whole school heats complete by 17.01.25**

- Class heats: Pupils in each class, present to peers, winners given certificate; then
- Whole-school heats: class winners present to whole school, winner(s) given certificate

• **Partnership heats complete by 28.02.25**

- Winning pupils present to other schools in Partnership

• **Gloucestershire finals 04.04.25**

- Winners from KS1/LKS2/UKS2 in each Partnership to present to other winners & panel

• **GAPH Conference 06.06.25**

- Winners for KS1, LKS2 & UKS2 will open GAPH 'Look Who's Talking' Oracy Conference
- 1st prize of **£150** & runner up prize of **£50** for schools, to use to further improve talk in their settings

WHAT IS INVOLVED?

Every pupil will have the opportunity to speak for two minutes in front of their class in the **Class Heats**, from which a 'Star Speaker' will be chosen. The Star Speakers from every class will then take part in **Whole-School Heats**, from which one representative for your school will be chosen for KS1, one for lower KS2 and one for upper KS2.

Partnership Heats will then take place, enabling these finalists to compete against their peers within your locality, before the three finalists for your Partnership (one from each phase) attend the **'Look Who's Talking! Gloucestershire Finals'** at Gloucester Guild Hall and compete against six other school Partnerships, in front of a judging panel, where an overall "Super Star Speaker" from each phase will be chosen.

The winners will take to the stage to open the 'Look Who's Talking!' GAPH Conference on 06.06.25 and win £150 for their school, with runner up prizes of £50, to use to further improve oracy.

WHAT SHOULD THEY TALK ABOUT?

The children can talk about *anything* that they choose to for their two-minute slot. They cannot use any technology but can bring any props that they wish to.
